## Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

This week in Chapel and Assembly, Rev Helen and the Head celebrated the International Day of Peace. Peace Day is observed around the world, for all to commit to peace above all differences and for all to contribute to building a culture of peace. Rev Helen reminded us of the word Shalom, which is an alternative word for peace meaning calm and tranquillity, with the congregation sharing a song around Shalom, to reflect on our own inner peace.

Pupils and staff have been engaged with the Co-Curriculum, trying out new and exciting clubs. Form tutors are encouraging all tutees to show courage by trying something new and signing up for a vast array of clubs on offer. Mr Sanderson reports that sports club attendance has been phenomenal, with hundreds of children getting involved. Please thank your children for their contribution and encourage them to have the courage to try something new.

Fixtures, trips and visits are back in full swing. May I take a moment to remind all in our community that a number of our pupils have anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a severe and often sudden allergic reaction to an allergen (such as a food or an insect sting); reactions usually begin within minutes of exposure and can progress rapidly. Anaphylaxis is potentially life-threatening and always requires an emergency response. With this in mind, please can we ask that nut products are not brought into school or on trips, visits or fixtures. Thank you for your support with this.

Our new staff Continuous Professional Learning (CPL) sessions, every Thursday after school, are underway, which shows our commitment to not only doing the best for our pupils, but also allowing our staff to engage in areas of interest and to develop professionally. Last week's session was greatly received with different workshops, meetings and training sessions on offer.

The Outdoor Education department has been busy preparing over the summer and has launched the Bronze, Silver and Gold Duke of Edinburgh Awards, and the Ten Tors annual challenge. Applications have been emailed to parents of the relevant year groups. I would like to warmly welcome Miss Katie Mayne to the Outdoor Education department, who will continue all the great work Mr Docherty did before his retirement. Miss Mayne will be leading the Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award here at school, as well as supporting all other areas of the department.

As pupils progress with their secondary education, we ask them to take greater responsibility in a number of areas. To help support the Co-Curriculum we use a programme called Misocs. There are user guides and links on the parental portal, but if you are a first-time user of Misocs, you will first need to activate your account and create your own password. All sports team sheets are password protected. The password is communicated to pupils in sports teams and we have included it in the body of the bulletin email. ## Peer to Peer Mentoring Support

At the end of the previous academic year, twenty-two Lower Sixth Formers successfully completed the ACHE (Advice, Care, Help, and Empathy) peer mentoring scheme. This 16-week training program forms part of the Sixth Form Diploma and equips students to provide support and guidance as peer mentors within the school.

Starting this week, Upper Sixth Formers are actively engaging with students across the School through various activities such as assemblies, a Macmillan Charity bake sale, and informal class drop-in sessions. Their aim is to raise awareness about their roles and offer a compassionate listening ear to any students in need.

During a recent assembly, Reverend Helen Byrne, who leads the program, spoke about finding inner peace and calm in celebration of United Nations World Peace Day. An ACHE mentor was invited to light a candle and the mentors shared information about their role in the school. Specifically addressing 5th Years, Reverend Helen encouraged pupils to connect with these mentors who have already experienced GCSE exams and can provide valuable advice and support based on their shared experiences.

Engaging in peer support allows individuals to share their experiences, offer guidance, and provide a listening ear to those facing challenges or seeking advice. This peer-to-peer support system is an effective component of the school's Pastoral network.

The ACHE mentoring program is open to all Lower Sixth Formers as part of the Sixth Form Diploma and covers an intensive curriculum that includes workshops on leadership, team building, peer listening, bullying/cyberbullying, sex and relationships, child protection, coping with stress/sleep hygiene, and learning support. The program culminates in an ACHE mentors' graduation dinner, enabling students to develop lifelong skills and qualities that will benefit them as colleagues, friends, and future leaders.




