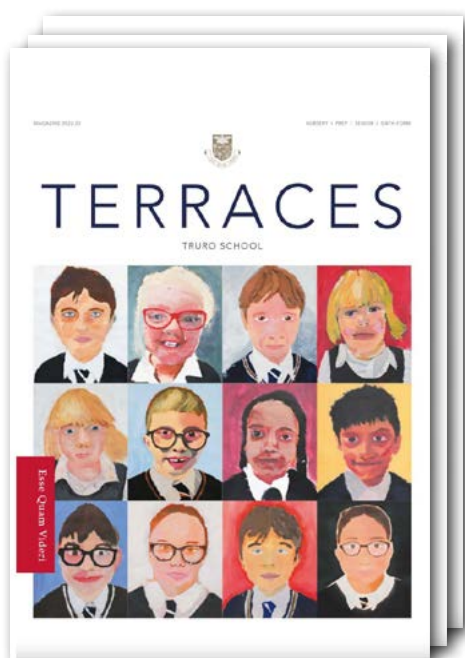

Visiting the interactive displays about the science of plants our boarders loved the 'Infinity Blue Breathing Sculpture' designed by Studio Swine, which pays homage to one of the world's smallest and most important organisms: Cyanobacteria. 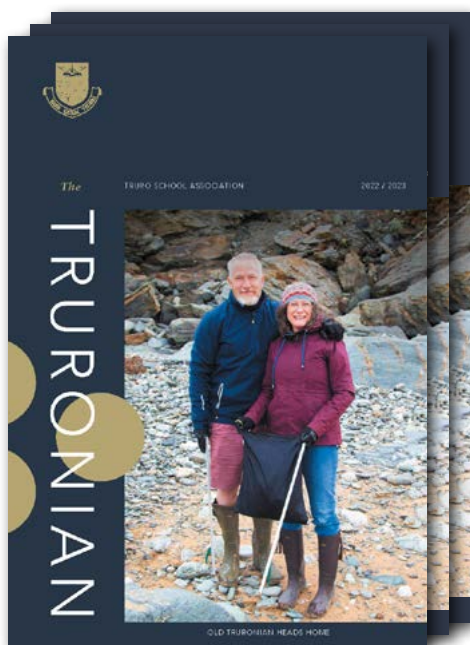

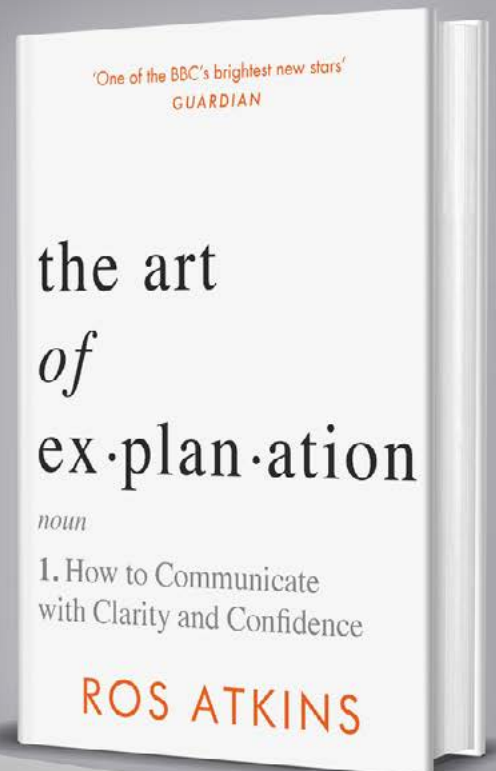

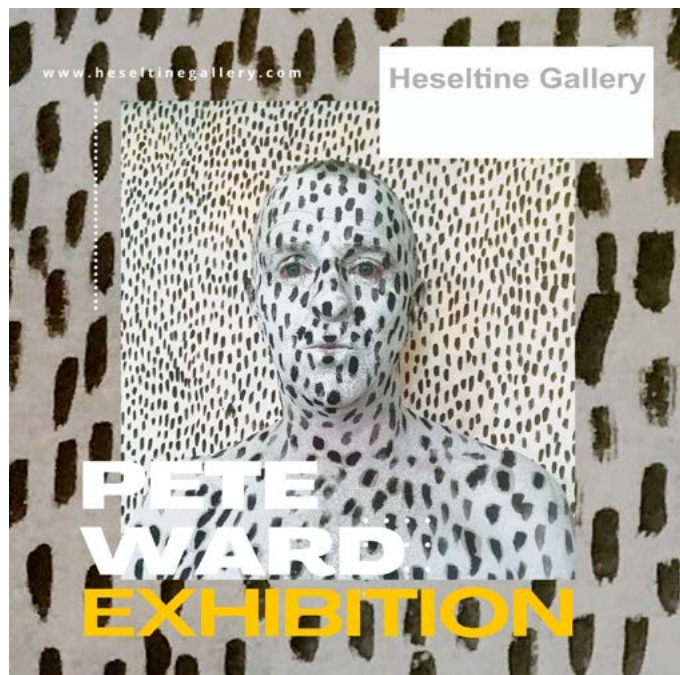
