You Are What You Eat

Diet and nutrition is a core module in the 2nd Year biology syllabus, with pupils learning about the components of a well-balanced diet. They are taught how to conduct food test experiments to detect carbohydrates, fat and proteins in various food items.

Pupils ran experiments on the food to determine if it contained the essential components required for a balanced diet. They analysed their findings and explored potential ways in which the food could be enhanced to fully meet its claimed nutritional benefits.

Practical experiments are an essential part of pupil learning and provide an excellent opportunity to acquire and practise good lab skills and teach pupils to gather, organise and evaluate their own data.

Discovering Ceramics

Wednesday afternoon clubs allow pupils to explore interests, cultivate new skills, uncover hidden talents, or simply try something completely new. We dropped into the ceramics club, where pupils were engrossed in clay slab building and developing relief designs inspired by their research on local surroundings, architecture and artists.

All pupils are introduced to ceramics in 1st and 2nd Year. As they progress, they can further develop their skills in this medium through scheduled art classes and, of course, this popular Wednesday afternoon activity.

Year 6 Activity Day

Learning Cornish, identifying local marine life, and making Cornish fairings were some of the highlights from this year's Year 6 activity day held at Truro School to give 90 prospective pupils a flavour of life at the Senior School.

After a morning of making new friends and challenging themselves to try new things, the Year 6 pupils had worked up an appetite. The catering department put on a delicious spread of Cornish-inspired foods featuring classic Cornish pasties, local sausages, and Cornish cupcakes.

The final activity of the day saw all the children come together for an afternoon of sport in a Pirates of Truro team game; working together in their groups the children tried to collect as much treasure as possible.

DT Dragons' Den

Our DT entrepreneurs pitched their A-Level project ideas to a panel of experts in the hopes of collecting some valuable feedback. In a Dragons' Den style performance, the Students communicated their plans to the panel sharing the process they've been through so far including initial ideas and development, as well as their future plans for their products.

The event provided valuable insight into professional designers' expectations and presented the students with positive feedback in advance of their final product.



Global Earthquake Monitoring

Did you know Truro School were able to detect seismic waves from the recent earthquake in Mount's Bay? We are fortunate to have our own seismometer here at Truro School. Our observations have led us to identify more than 2000 earthquakes, with many occurring in distant locations.

This lunchtime, our Geology Club pupils were excited to study the data collected from the seismograph during this event and to learn about 'P' & 'S' waves and how to identify them on the graph.

A message from the Director of Sport

We are half way through the second half of the term and some of you may have seen me walking to school; sadly my bike has broken but fingers crossed, I'll be back on two wheels soon...

However, this is a space for more important things than my commute to work, and I am hopeful the information below will be a useful starting point to check in with your young person(s); especially around the world of PE and sport as well as helpful reminders.

- 1) Thank you to parents and pupils for all of the outstanding support so far this term. There is a great buzz around our fixtures and it has been lovely to see so many parents supporting teams. Please remember to sign in on arrival at the SBA and, as always, encourage the opposition as much as our own team. I am proud that we are known across our community as a school that is a good host.
- 2) Academic pressures are increasing in the older years, and I want to re-enforce that the PE team is here and ready to help with balance. We want to provide opportunities for our young people to get active and escape any pressure they may feel, but we also understand how important that this time is for them. Please encourage pupils to speak with us, and we will be happy to work with them.
- 3) The feedback from staff who are running clubs and teams has been wonderful to hear; the pupils' politeness, coachability and effort is shining through. I am so proud of the approach that our pupils have.
- 4) Fixtures - please keep an eye on SOCS for fixture dates and team sheets. We appreciate that you will have many moving parts at home to manage and that sometimes, pupils will have to miss fixtures. Please try to let us know as early as possible, as we need time to find a replacement.
- 5) Changing rooms - a reminder that pupils should hand in valuables to staff for safe keeping. They should change in the space allocated to them (written on the door). Spray deodorant should not be brought into school, please use a roll-on.
- 6) Please check footwear; we are still seeing school shoes (Air Force Ones) being used as trainers - this raises hygiene issues, and these shoes do not offer the correct support for pupils.
- 7) Have you seen any of our Truro School match kit around the house? Please encourage the safe return of kit as we are missing a considerable amount of items and are struggling to provide full team kits. When returned, no questions will be asked.

As always, please reach out to the PE team/Heads of Sport/coaches if you have a question or query, as I appreciate there is so much going on.

I have really enjoyed this Autumn term and if the next term is even half as good, it will be a fantastic Spring Term.

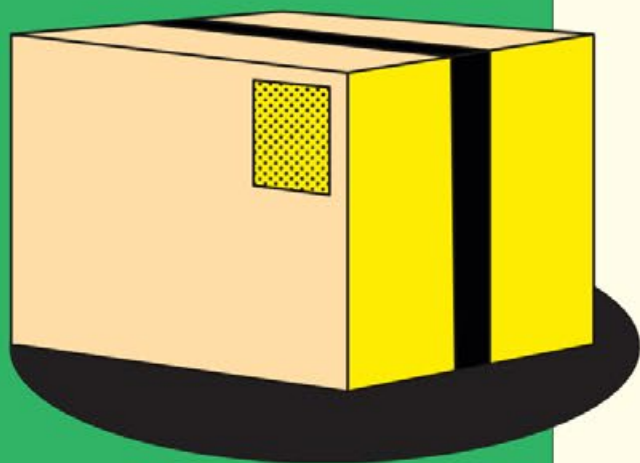
