## Geologists Explore 'Gold Hydrogen'

This week, our A-level geology students had the privilege of hearing from David Waltham, Professor of Geophysics at Royal Holloway.

Professor Waltham discussed the potential of 'Gold' hydrogen in transitioning away from fossil fuels. The talk covered recent geological studies indicating the presence of abundant and cost-effective naturally occurring hydrogen reserves beneath the Earth's surface.

Miss Hope said that it was a fantastic opportunity for the students to learn about cutting edge geological research exploring both its advantages and challenges as a newfound natural resource.

## An Invitation to all 2nd Years - Geology Mining Games

The Geology Department are excited to invite 2nd Years to participate in the upcoming Geology Mining Games.

Pupils will compete in various traditional mining disciplines including mucking, mineral processing, hand-steeling, gold panning, swede sawing, and surveying.

During the summer term the students will be required to attend the weekly Friday lunchtime sessions where the prefects will train them in each of the disciplines.

As part of preparations for the competition day the teams will take part in a Pre-event visit to King Edward Mine during the first half of the summer term to learn more about the event and hear from Mining Geologists involved at South Crofty Mine.

## A message from Mr Sanderson re Return2Play

Dear Parents, Carers and Guardians,

I have been really pleased with the introduction of the return2play system that we have adopted since the start of September 2023, which helps the school and parents manage any potential concussions that pupils may suffer and tracks their recovery time. In September, an email was sent to all parents, explaining the use for return2play and how to log in for the first time. The vast majority of you will not need to use this system but it is a valuable resource and this message is a reminder of how return2play can help and how to access the system, should you need it.

Concussion is usually associated with sport but can happen anywhere. As a Truro School parent, you are able to record an injury anywhere in the world and at any time; not just in school time or during sport. When you log an injury, an email is sent to you (the email you use for school communication) and you are then asked to follow the steps listed. This will generate an appointment with a concussion specialist doctor, who will assess your child and recommend the next steps. The school are also copied in, which will allow us to monitor and adapt the support that is needed.

Below is some information from return to play, with the support email at the bottom. If you are able to search through your inbox, you will see the original email sent in September.

*What is the Return2Play System?*

*The return2play system is an injury management system. It is an innovative, whole-organisation, cloud-based platform which makes it quick and easy for organisations to safely manage all pupils injuries. It facilitates the provision of expert medical care in the case of a concussion.*

*If you, or your child, suffers a concussion and you are a member on the Return2Play System, you will be able to have immediate and convenient appointments with the UK's leading experts in concussion. Making sure that you receive gold-standard care and follow the concussion guidelines before safely returning to sport.*

*What emails will I receive?*

*If an injury is recorded on the Return2Play system to you, or your child, you will receive an automatic notification. If the injury is a concussion, you will also receive helpful information on concussion signs and symptoms, and how to book an appointment with one of our doctors. You will not receive any marketing or promotional material. If you have any queries then please get in touch with us via [hello@return2play.org.uk](mailto:hello@return2play.org.uk) and we will be happy to help.*

I have had very positive feedback from parents and pupils that have used the system and if you would like to share your experience with me, I would love to hear from you.
