## Dear Parents and Carers,

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## Fun and Finds at the FTS Beach Clean

## Getting A Taste for Languages in Year 5

Pupils in Year 5 study a different language each term, rotating around French, Spanish and German. In the summer term, each class then visits Truro School Cookery, for a cookery workshop based on that language.

On the menu for 5CD was German, with a delicious recipe for a spiced apple, cherry and sultana plait being made as a nod to the German strudel.

Not only is this a fantastic way to learn new vocabulary, it is also a wonderful opportunity for our Year 5s to experience the facilities and teaching at the Senior School, in this case, our state-of-the-art kitchen led by Mr Rosenthal. Future sessions will include French and Spanish cuisine, which we are confident will be equally as delicious.



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## Up, Up and Away in Nursery

Mrs Banks and the Nursery team took their transport topics to new heights with the arrival of a hot air balloon at Truro School Prep.

The Nursery children were first treated to a talk from Tilly and Rose's mum, Veryan Palmer, who is Hotel Director at the Headland Hotel where the balloon is kept. The children had previously read a story about a hot air balloon and had lots of questions that they needed to answer including, how many people can you fit into the balloon and how does it inflate?

Out on the field, the excited children were able to explore first-hand the different features of the balloon including the basket that carries passengers and the balloon envelope that inflates with air. Nursery were then joined by the rest of the Prep School and staff; many of whom had never seen a hot air balloon up close before.

Safely tethered to the ground, the burners were lit and the balloon was inflated, much to the delight of everyone present.

All of our pupils were simply ecstatic to be up close to such an incredible form of transport and we would like to say a huge thank you to Mrs Banks, Veryan, Pilot John Armstrong and the rest of the crew from the Headland Hotel. 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## Neurodiversity Week

This week, Truro School Prep have been marking neurodiversity week and learning more about the meaning of this word. National Neurodiversity Celebration Week takes place on the 18th-22nd March and with World Autism Acceptance week falling on the 2-8th April (during the Easter break), we felt that the start of summer term would be a wonderful time to raise awareness of the diversity, strengths and differences within the world around us.

For the Prep pupils the week started with an assembly led by SENDCO, Mrs Waddling-Height, who introduced the word neurodiversity to the pupils and used the analogy of a woodland to educate the students on this term. She explained to the children that:

“Thinking about the way that in a woodland the trees are similar and different can help us think about the ways that people can be similar and different from one another. Just like there is no “right” or “wrong” kind of tree, there’s no right or wrong kind of person. Everyone belongs as a part of their community, just like all the trees belong together in the woods; Some of the trees need different conditions to grow and thrive and fulfil their potential.”

During Year 2-6 tutor time this week, pupils were able to learn more about neurodiversity and appreciating that everyone thinks, learns and processes information differently. Neurodiversity is all about recognising this and understanding that people’s brains work in different ways. In some cases, for example, if you are autistic or have ADHD or dyslexia, these differences can be more pronounced. It’s a good idea to talk to your child about these differences, to help them develop greater understanding of people who are different from themselves.
